FAQs

Q: Can you apply to more than one place?

A: Yes- in fact it's very sensible to have a backup plan which needs fewer GCSEs!

Q: Should I check up on the times and dates before going to any of the events?

A: Yes- look on the organisation website. Sometimes dates and times change.

Q: Where can I find applications forms?

A: Most are online now or see Mrs Crewe.

Q: What do I do with my application form once I have completed it?

A: Fasten a copy of your personal Statement to it and hand it in to Mrs Crewe in her office near Reception.

Q: Do I need my Record of Achievement?

A: Yes! Send a copy of your Personal Statement in with your application for if you can- it really helps the colleges etc.

Q: Do you have to be a Catholic to go to St Mary's RC College?

A: No!

Q: Can you book a careers interview for unbiased advice and information?

A: Yes- see Mrs Crewe in her office near Reception on Mondays, Tuesdays or Thursdays at Lunchtime, or write her a note.
